

Gunnersbury Park Museum case study

Hounslow Council and Ealing Council, jointly own Gunnersbury Park Museum. In 2014 the councils were awarded two grants by the Heritage Lottery Fund to overhaul the museum and make major improvements to the park.

The museum is located in Gunnersbury Park House a grade 2* listed building with its own rich history. The house is located within a grade 2* registered parkland landscape with 22 other listed buildings. This landscape has been a public park for almost 100 years with many features that pre-date the house by 100 years



The initial phase of £21m investment marks the first big step towards realising the 15-year masterplan 'Gunnersbury 2026'. The project aims to transform Gunnersbury into a sustainable, high quality public space that serves the local community and beyond. Gunnersbury's rich history will be preserved for future generations to enjoy and our development plans will see the creation of a diverse and lively mix of culture, heritage, events, sports and recreational activities.

Instrom was appointed as the security consultant to work with the project team to ensure the security of the collections and other Museum assets. The first action was to undertake a risk assessment of the Museum and the park to identify and quantify the potential threats facing the premises and their contents identifying items of particular risk and likely route of access for intruders.

Following the Risk Assessment a detailed Security Strategy was developed which would form the basis for any security measures and policies to be adopted.



The final part of the appointment was to produce designs and specifications for the security systems and equipment to be installed as part of the refurbishment project that respect the historic significance of these house and grounds.
